# **GENERAL COURTESIES**

- Contact the provincial or municipal office well in advance of the production date. Permits, permissions and expectations for filming, locations, vehicles and transportation may vary between jurisdictions in Manitoba.
- Follow the provisions of all location permits issued by the Province, a municipality or other local government. Extensions and requests for changes to permits must be made and granted in writing.
- The Manitoba Highway Traffic Act is in effect at all times.
- Removing or cutting signs or plants from any public or private location without permission is prohibited.
- Reduce, reuse and recycle.
- Whenever production activities may directly affect or disrupt daily lives, notify the public in writing five business days in advance. Include the following information:
  - The working title of the project;
  - The name of the company;
  - Contact information for the production;
  - The date and time of disruption; and
  - A brief, clear description of the activity.

# **PROFESSIONALISM**

- No trespassing on private property. Remain within the boundaries of the permitted locations and do not use items that have not been approved for use by the production.
- Maintain all properties in original or better condition.
- All equipment in public spaces should be stored neatly, and cables should be channeled safely.
- The consumption of alcohol and cannabis is prohibited.
- Tobacco smoking, meal services and eating are allowed in designated areas only. Dispose of cigarette butts in appropriate containers.
- Keep noise and talking to a minimum at all times and refrain from using lewd or improper language.
- Wear a production pass as required.
- No guests or pets are allowed on location without advance permission.
- Offensive or objectionable materials on clothing or vehicles will not be tolerated.
- Comply with the Manitoba Workplace Safety and Health Act, the Manitoba Workplace Safety and Health Regulation and The Manitoba Media Production Industry Safety and Health Guidelines. Maintain a respectful workplace at all times.
